Annual MCFL All Staff Day

The annual Marin County Free Library All Staff Day was held on Friday, September 23 at the Osher Marin Jewish Community Jewish Center. The theme this year was "Connect Collaborate Create" to highlight the evolving activities and partnerships of the 21st Century Marin County Free Library.

The day kicked off with a high energy start—the very entertaining "Happy" video (available on the MCFL Library YouTube Page) created by the staff committee responsible for the planning of the day. County Administrator Matthew H. Hymel then spoke about the County of Marin's 5-Year Business Plan. Library Director Sara Jones spoke next, praising and highlighting the accomplishments of the past year in the State of the Library Address. The Library has made major movement on the goals of the Strategic Plan and she spoke of the accomplishments related to Youth, Digital Services and Equity.

Barbara Madrid eloquently spoke about the Friends of the Marin County Free Library fundraising and accomplishments over the past year to thunderous applause of gratitude from the staff. The "Top 10 Ways to Support the Friends!" flyer was distributed stressing simple ways to financially support the Friends in the work they do for the community.

After a break MCFL staff members Sara Hathaway and Kathleen Fitzhugh-Remitz highlighted an upcoming life skills training supported by a recently awarded grant for "Mind in the Making" based on the work of Ellen Gallinsky. Digital Initiatives Manager detailed the numerous enhancements in the electronic world including a new catalog and website. Daniel Avalos presented about what the staff committee related to communication accomplished.

Sara Jones and John McLeod, executive director of the Community Education Center Makerspace – Media Studio, engaged in a provocative discussion over the collaboration of the South Novato Library, Novato Unified School District and New Media Learning to create the Community Education Center. The discussion talked about the future of libraries and exciting new technologies such as Virtual Reality and creating in the Maker Space.

During lunch MCFL staff had an opportunity to present numerous branch initiatives in poster sessions on topics such as the Seed Library at Fairfax, the Career Online High School Diploma and similar projects throughout the system.

The day started to wind down with a presentation from Katie DeKorte from the Sacramento Library who demonstrated simple creative projects libraries can do with children and teens with minimal cost. The day concluded with the heartfelt employee recognition and staff photo.

The MCFL All Staff day is the only day of the year staff from across the County are able to connect, share and learn together to make the organization stronger to serve the community. Staff left happy, fulfilled and energized to continue the work of serving the community.

Your membership donation

County Friends voted at its August meeting to increase the share of the membership dues going to the county from 50% of the first \$25 to 50% of the first \$50. That means when you join a local chapter at the \$100 level, \$25 will go to the County Friends, and \$75 will stay with your local branch. This decision was made in order to continue and fully fund important programs that benefit all of our libraries, including Summer Learning, STEAM activities, One Book/ One Marin, year-round children's and teen programs and more.

In an effort to increase revenues, we are also emphasizing other ways to give financial support to libraries, such as eScrip, AmazonSmile, and workplace giving with corporate match.

Go to eScrip.com to register with the Friends of the Marin County Free Library and register the credit card you use at local participating stores and restaurants, including Nugget Markets, Fairfax Market, Woodlands Market, Marin Coffee Roasters, and more. The Corte Madera Library is excited about hosting Indie Author Day on Saturday, October 8, from 10am-5pm. Authors of multiple genres will be speaking, including Rhys Bowen and Dewey Livingston. The Library's own Jen Robinson, Digital Initiatives Manager, and Laurie Thompson, California Room Librarian, will be presenting. The goals of the program are to support local writers, showcase SELF-e and other MCFL resources, and to partner with local organizations that support selfpublishing. SELF-e, the Library's new, free, online self-publishing platform, is a collaboration between Library Journal and BiblioBoard to bring self-published books to a wider audience through their local libraries. There will be food, and chocolate! Speakers will be selling their books and we hope to raise some money for the Friends of MCFL. Continuing our productive partnership with CMA Parks and Rec Dept., another Senior Seminar is in the works on Monday, October 24, 10:30am—noon: "Know the 10 Signs: Early Alzheimer's Detection," a presentation by the North Bay Alzheimer's Association.

On the culture front, the next in our series of Art Talk Tuesdays will be on October 18, when Fine Arts Museums of San Francisco Docent Rita Dunlay will present an illustrated lecture "The Brothers Le Nain: Painters of 17th Century France" at 7pm. We'll also be featuring an "Evening of Classical Guitar" with Joseph Bacon on Thursday, October 20 at 7pm. All are welcome to come to the library and actually view art, as we will be exhibiting "Extra-Ordinary Shapes" from the Marin Watercolor Society from October 1-November 17. Come meet the artists on Saturday, October 22, from 10am -12 noon.

Of course, with Fall our regular storytimes return, with Baby Bounce on Tuesday mornings at 10am, for babies 0-2 years old, Toddler Time with Ollie for 2 year olds on Wednesdays at 10am, and Preschool Storytime for ages 3 and up on Wednesdays at 11 am. The Kids' Book Club for grades 4 and up meets on Wed. October 19 at 7pm to talk about *The Wild Robot* by Peter Brown. And, we're gearing up for another exciting season of the Newbery Guess—our children's librarians will be visiting local schools to talk about the frontrunners in the contest for the Newbery Award for Children's Literature. We invite all kids to vote for their favorites at the library—prizes generously donated by the Friends of the Corte Madera Library.

Always wanted to try downloading books? Or streaming a movie? Come in and talk to a friendly librarian to get started. Individual appointments are available, or drop by on Wednesday nights from 7-8pm for help with downloading ebooks from OverDrive or the Cloud Library.

And finally, a few highlights from our summer. We had over a thousand kids and teens participate in summer learning this year, and here is one of our very happy raffle winners showing off the great book she won, and the amazing Sterling the Bubblesmith in action—"en-bubbling" a kid whole!





We had a special visit from the FLAGship's Linda Varonin and Allie Cruz. They did a wonderful storytime for the kids, and all the kids got to visit the FLAGship and see what it looked like. The FLAGship acts like a mobile preschool, and travels around the County to provide access to preschool for kids who don't get the opportunity to attend. Linda Varonin performed our storytime and did a craft activity with the kids.

We participated in the Marin City Back-to-School Rally. The Marin City Friends purchased pencils, and other school supplies to hand out.


Diana and staff are working with Bayside/MLK school to ensure that all new students at the school have library cards.

Notes from Novato


